The program started on July 10th and ended on August 18th with a total of 5045 lunches distributed. Catholic Daughters distributed 1551, Grace Church 1388, and Taft 2106.

A huge thanks goes to John Flores and his team, Brian Manngard and Bill Preston. I think I can compare the Food Pantry to the gospel story of the loaves and fishes. Every time we needed food it just miraculously appeared and there was always more than enough. Without John Flores and the Pantry this program would NOT HAVE HAPPENED.


Silent Auction & Coctail Party


- ► Collect **boxtops** for Education and register shopping cards online.to benefit St. Mary's Little Lambs Preschool
