Get to Know our National Cleray



RECIPE OF THE MONTH: SWEET POTATO CASSEROLES (By Tijani on "shared.com")

Ingredients: 2 sweet potatoes For the topping: 1/4 cup brown sugar

2 tbsp. brown sugar
2 tbsp. orange juice
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 tbsp. cinnamon
1/4 cup chopped pecans
2 tbsp. butter, melted
1/4 tsp. cinnamon

Directions; Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Place sweet potatoes in a pot and fill with enough water to cover them

Bring water to a boil and cook until the potatoes are fork tender

Remove sweet potatoes from water and cut them into 1 1/2 in slices and place them on a greased baking sheet

Slide the peel off of the sweet potato slices. Sit end pieces of potatoes to the side

Use a spoon to take a scoop out of the center of each sweet potato slice, making sure not to go through the bottom

In a small bowl mash the scooped out portions and the end pieces of the sweet potatoes, together with the brown sugar, orange juice, and cinnamon

Stuff the sweet potato mash back into the sweet potato slices

Make the topping by mixing the brown sugar, chopped pecans, butter and cinnamon together

Pour topping over each sweet potato slice

Bake for 30 minutes or until topping is bubbling

Remove from oven and serve.


