ST. MARY'S CONFIRMATION CLASS ALERT

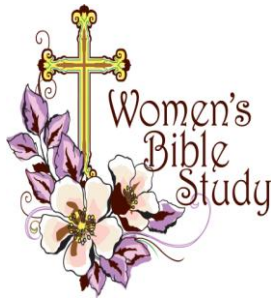


There will be NO class for Level 7 on Monday, January 9.



Dear St. Mary's Family,

The vast majority of the time, the bulletin article that I write each week appears identically for both parishes.
