

There <u>are</u> classes this week even though there is no school.





Dear St. Mary's Family,

Recently, I have been reading a book entitled, *To Sanctify the World: The Vital Legacy of Vatican II.* The book is written by George Weigel, the papal biographer of Pope St. John Paul II. The book is an excellent synthesis of the documents of the Council, and provides much needed insight into the most important event in the Catholic Church in the last century.

At the end of the book, the author describes the influence and understanding of the Council by the two Popes who were present at it, John Paul II (Karol Wojtyla) and Benedict XVI (Joseph Ratzinger). At that time, Wojtyla was an auxiliary bishop of Krakow and Ratzinger was a priest advisor to the Archbishop of Munich. Both men were instrumental in the drafting and final edition of the Council documents and were committed to its authentic implementation after.

On August 6, 1978, Pope St. Paul VI died and the cardinals gathered in Rome to elect his successor. Anyone who has been to Rome in August knows how unbearably hot it is and the Cardinal electors had no air conditioning in the Sistine Chapel or their private rooms. One evening Karol Wojtyla, at this point Cardinal-archbishop of Krakow, and Joseph Ratzinger by then the Cardinal-archbishop of Munich decided to take a walk through the Vatican gardens in the cool of the evening. They found their theological views similar and the two remained close friends until the death of John Paul II.

The conclave they were at would go on to elect Albino Luciani who took the name John Paul. After just 33 days he died and the cardinals gathered again this time electing Wojtyla. Nearly 27 years later Ratzinger was elected as the successor to his friend.

Following Benedict's death three weeks ago, I thought back to the scene of the two of them walking through the garden. I have every reason to believe that these two great and holy men now walk together again through the verdant pastures and everlasting gardens in the house of the Father.
