Parish Census 2020 –Starting with Religious Ed Families

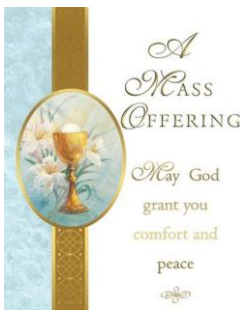

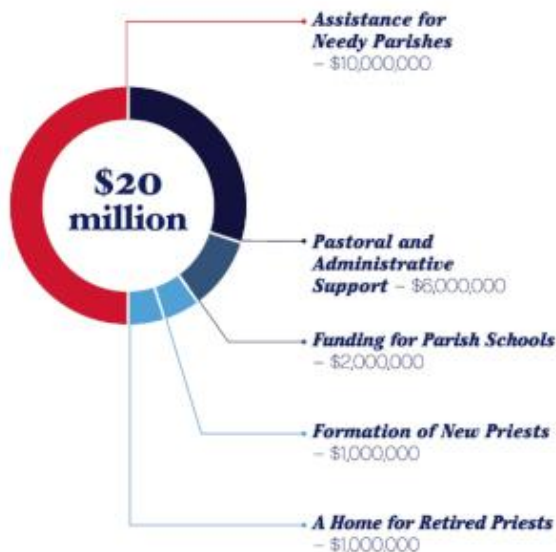

SHE WAS INSPIRED BY THE TEACHING OF SAINT PATRICK.

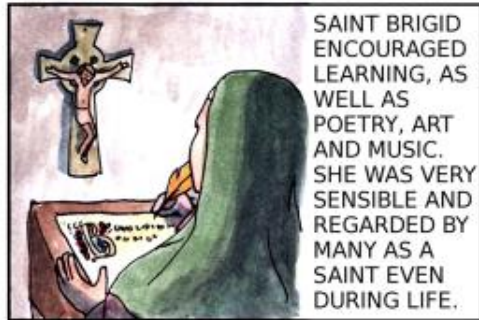


BRIGID DEDICATED HER LIFE TO GOD AND RECEIVED THE VEIL FROM SAINT MEL.
