

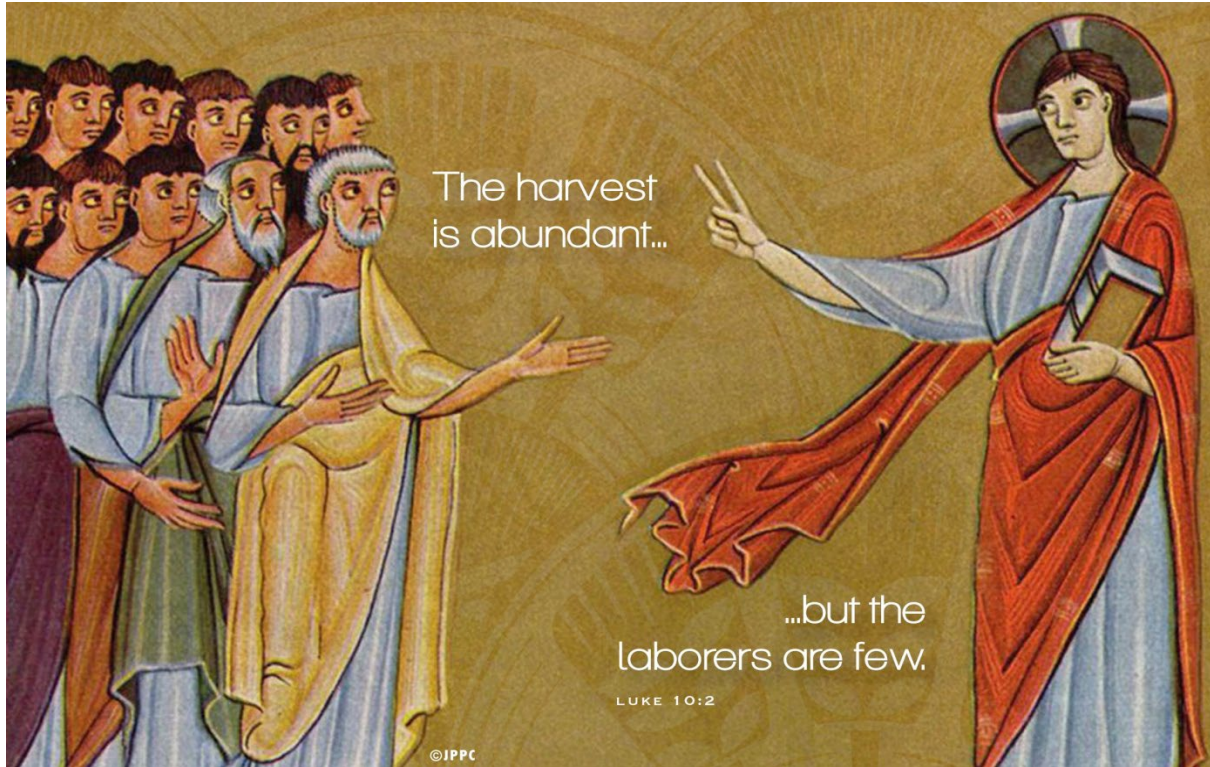

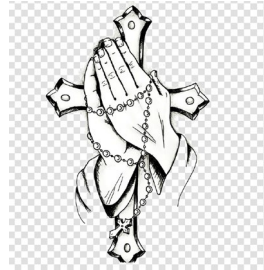

CEMETERY REGULATIONS

Please review the following Cemetery Regulations. Objects, such as plastic flowers and benches, make it difficult to properly mow the cemetery grounds. Thank you for your adherence to these regulations.

All deed holders, their families and friends shall be allowed on the grounds during daylight hours only, strictly observing all proprieties due in a cemetery.

All work done on the grounds is subject to the control and direction of St. Mary's Church and the Pastor.

Removal of sod and digging of holes is prohibited.

Anything solid, which might damage cemetery machinery, is not allowed. No benches. All glass is prohibited including glass blocks or any item partly of glass except vigil lights.

Plantings in front of stones may not extend more than 12 inches. Artificial flowers, wreaths, and designs, or all other decorative objects are not allowed. Cemetery personnel will remove all Christmas decorations after January 1, including those fastened to monuments.

Flags are permitted on graves only on Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Veteran's Day. They may be placed seven (7) days prior to the holiday and will be removed after the eighth (8) day following the holiday. Statues are prohibited unless part of the monument.

All objects shall be removed which violate the above regulations or when in the judgment of the cemetery superintendent, their appearance and condition warrant removal. Cemetery is not responsible for accidental damage caused by routine maintenance.

Thousands of people visit the cemetery each year. Because the cemetery is open to the public, it is impossible to control the activity of every visitor. We regret we cannot guarantee decorations from damage or disappearance.

Safety Tips When using Sparklers

- Only use sparklers outside
- Children using sparklers must be supervised by an adult
- Never use sparklers when impaired by alcohol or drugs. If you are impaired, you should not be a designated supervisor.
- Always keep sparklers at arm's length away from the body
- Do not run with, throw, or hand-off a sparkler
- Wear closed-toe shoes to help prevent foot burns
- When done with a sparkler, douse it in water or put it in a bucket to prevent any mishaps
- Once cool, dispose of sparklers in a waste bin. Do not leave them lying around for health, safety, and environmental reasons.

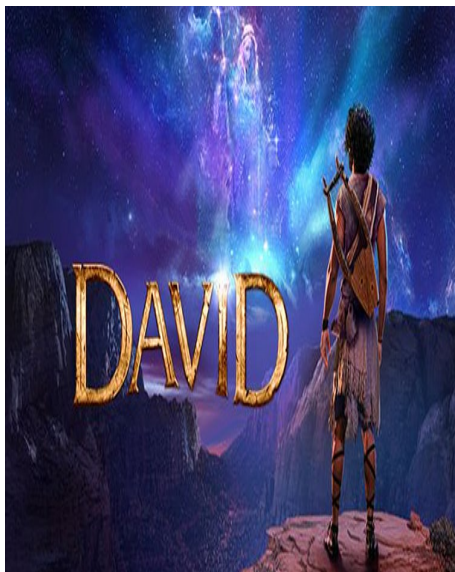




See David at Sight and Sound Theater
