
CEMETERY REGULATIONS

Dear St. Mary's Family,

One of the greatest joys we priests have is celebrating the sacrament of baptism. It is a beautiful gift to be able to welcome one of God's little ones into our family of faith at the waters of the font. A unique experience and equally profound and beautiful is when we have the opportunity, usually during the Easter season, to baptize an adult, or someone old enough to understand what is happening and able to make the promises of baptism for them self.

Usually the one presented for baptism is an infant so the parents and Godparents make that promise for the baby. The fact that God imparts the gift of eternal life to one who is not able to do anything for them self yet shows the utterly gratuitous nature of God's goodness and love. Nothing this baby has done merits them eternal life yet God gives it as pure gift, reminding us that salvation is not a prize we win but a gift we accept. But the obligation then rests on the parents and Godparents to keep that gift of faith alive in the heart of the child until they are ready to embrace the faith once they are old enough to understand. This is why choosing Godparents should not be taken lightly. There are many good people who will be a part of the child's life but a Godparent is more than this. They are meant to be a model of faith for the child. It makes no sense to have someone as a Godparent who neither lives the faith nor believes in it.

Baptism is a profound blessing that opens the door to every other sacrament we will receive. Several years ago a reporter asked Pope St. John Paul II what the most important day of his life was. Expecting him to say the day he became Pope or his ordination as a priest the Holy Father simply said, "The day of my baptism." He knew that without that day nothing else in his faith life would have been possible. The centrality of our baptism and its connection to the rest of our faith life is realized in an almost unconscious way when we walk into church. How many of us reflexively dip our hands into the font to bless ourselves?

One of the disconcerting elements during COVID was the absence of holy water. It's bizarre to dip our hand into the font only to be met by more air or a dry basin. Yet we do this not as some rote action but as a reminder of our baptism. The fact that we are here at church and look forward to receiving the Eucharist is because we are baptized and this action, so simple and so common, is a reminder of the gift given to us the day of our baptism, the day we became part of the family of God and inherited the promise of eternal life.
