

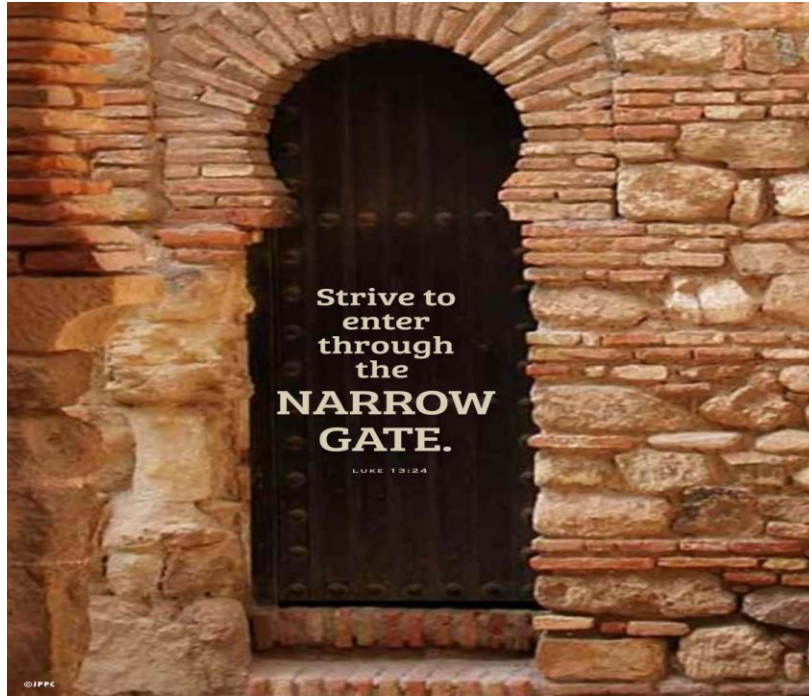

Catholicism 101 –
RCIA Classes to begin Sept. 12 2022

Adults 18 and over are welcome to participate in this class designed for Adult Catholics and Non-Catholics who wish to learn more about our faith. Led by Deacon Barney and Rory Kahn, this fun, interactive weekly course dives into different topics each week about our faith, heritage, liturgy and history. Using a conversational format supported by slides and fun videos, you will come away each week with things that you forgot about or are surprised to learn about in Catholicism.

This course is also designed to assist anyone wishing to prepare for Confirmation, Communion or Baptism. Known as RCIA, (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults), this preparation helps you receive the fullest grace of the Sacraments.

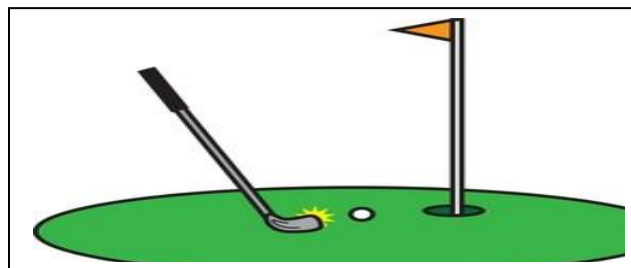


CATHOLIC CHARITIES' 16TH ANNUAL GOLF FOR CHARITY OUTING

Dear St. Mary's Family,

Summer is usually a time when everything in the parish begins to slow down, but there have been quite a few things going on at St. Mary's. For starters, our raffle brought in over \$20,000 to the parish. There actually were three \$1,000 winners from St. Mary's. Congratulations to them! I am overwhelmed by the response and I am so grateful for the many people who took part in it. This will be a big help to our parish and to some of the projects that we are looking forward to moving on.

On a more unfortunate note, our music director, Alyssa McCabe, has taken a new job closer to where her family has moved in Wappingers Falls. We will miss her beautiful voice and we wish her well in this new chapter of her life.

Finally, since the start of COVID, we have broadcast the Mass over the radio so that people could sit in their cars to listen. This was instituted as an important and innovative emergency measure. However, after two and a half years, with new guidance from the CDC, the availability of therapeutics for those who contract COVID, and the fact that, for the most part, we have all accepted the reality that COVID will be with us in the future, it is time for us to come together again in church.

As of the weekend of September 10-11, the Mass will no longer be broadcast over the radio. Tetreau Hall will remain available for the time being for those who may still want to social distance. Being together to worship is such an integral part of our Catholic life; it is time for all of us to be together again.
