


THIS WEEK!

Dear St. Mary's Family,

The two months of the year that are traditionally devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary are May and October. May, because we are in the springtime enjoying new life budding all around us. We remember how the new life of the redeemed, those saved through faith in Jesus, came from Mary's "yes" to the archangel Gabriel.

October is dedicated to her because of the victory at the battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The Turkish forces were advancing on Europe and a small Christian fleet was dispatched to repel the far larger armada. Knowing the odds were stacked against them, Pope St. Pius V asked all of Europe to pray the rosary so that the fleet could be victorious despite this nearly impossible prospect against the enemy. Incredibly the Christians won the battle and the Pope declared October 7th the feast of Our Lady of Victory. Later it was renamed to Our Lady of the Rosary since it was praying the rosary that enabled the heavily overmatched fleet to repel the invaders.

It is interesting that this feast day is associated with an actual battle since the rosary truly is a weapon. But it is a weapon, not in the sense of fighting a war of earthly realities, but of an entirely different spiritual realm. We know that when we pray the rosary we are brought closer to Jesus and Mary and that we protect ourselves against the strength of all of the temptations that surround us. It is a beautiful tradition in families to pray a rosary, or at least a decade of the rosary, every day to thank Mary for her love, her protection, and her guidance.

As we honor Mary in October, we do so in the month dedicated to respecting life. We ask for Mary's maternal protection for the most vulnerable in our society, especially the unborn. We ask through her intercession that there be a greater respect for all human life and that the weakest among us be granted the protections that we share as members of the same human family who are privileged and blest to have Mary as our mother.
