

Brother Zach has been with us for a month already on his pastoral year before hoping to begin his final two years of preparation for the priesthood. He's already been a great help to us here and is starting work at Orange Regional visiting patients in addition to the various ministries here at Saint Mary's – he's a bit older than our normal brothers – he's 45! But the story of who he is and how he got here is quite amazing – so here are his words –

"Oftentimes people will ask a seminarian when did he first think he was called to the priesthood? I'm unusual. It wasn't until my early thirties that I thought about the priesthood. I wasn't even Catholic.

My journey began in the winter of 2005. For Lent, I participated in a homeless befriending ministry at Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in Manhattan. Before dawn, on Tuesday mornings, I volunteered as an outreach worker. On the church's steps, I would encounter bundled figures huddled in cardboard boxes. I served hot coffee to the men and women who had spent the night on the steps. I learned their names and listened to their stories.

After coffee with the homeless, oftentimes, I would go to the Catholic church near my apartment to pray. I was drawn to Saint Monica's Church on East 79th Street because in the beautiful sanctuary, I experienced a deep sense of peace. As I reflect back on those long-a-go experiences, I believe God was drawing me to the Eucharist, to prepare me for my conversion and mission."



### Brother Zach's Intro to Saint Mary's continued...

In 2010, I went to California to study theology and ministry at the San Francisco Theological Seminary. During the spring semester, I started attending Sunday night Mass at the parish across the road from the Presbyterian seminary. I sat in the back pew and observed men and women genuflect, kneel and pray. As I watched people being received into the Church, I experienced the call to become Catholic.

My conversion to Catholicism reached fruition at Saint Monica's Church of San Francisco. I started attending the daily Mass. I was inspired by the kind example, excellent preaching, and care for the community by the pastor, Father John Greene.

One morning after Mass, he caught me before I was about to leave the building. In the vestibule, we talked. I told him for a long time I wanted to become Catholic. From that moment, we became friends. He received me into the Church on June 17, 2012, ironically, Father's Day.


In the fall of 2014, I began formal discernment of the priesthood with the Archdiocese of San Francisco at Saint Patrick's Seminary and University in Menlo Park, California. In general, my five years at Saint Patrick's were a positive experience. At the end of each academic year, after writing papers, taking exams, spiritual direction and making countless Holy Hours, I felt a growing sense that the hand of God was guiding me towards resolution. Also, I felt a calling to come back to New York, where I had served coffee to the homeless and prayed in Catholic churches.

It is a blessing to be here at Saint Mary's Church. This year I will assist the priests and deacons with Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and youth groups. I will also intern at ORMC to learn hospital chaplaincy. If all goes well, I will finish out my last two years of seminary education at Saint Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, and God willing become a priest for the Archdiocese of New York.
