






ROSARY WORKSHOP



Dear St. Mary's Family,

Although this article has to do mainly with St. Columba, I know that some people go to both places. It is also good for us to know what is happening at our sister parish in Chester.

Sometimes in the life of a parish difficult decisions need to be made, as we assess the current situation and look to the future. Since the return of the noon Mass at St. Columba at the end of summer, the attendance has been very low. I waited several weeks before making a decision. In consultation with staff, the determination is that as of the first Sunday of Advent, November 27th, the noon Mass at St. Columba will be suspended indefinitely. A similar decision was made last year at St. Mary's with the suspension of the 5:30 Mass on Saturday evening.

Although, right now we are blessed to have three active priests and a weekend associate, I am all too aware of how quickly things can change,(To stop the rumor mill before it starts, there is nothing that gives me reason to think there will be a change in the priests serving both parishes). Cutting out a Mass goes against everything I would want as a pastor- since it is an implicit admission that Mass attendance is not what we would want it to be. This is sad, but it is the reality.

I know that it has been an adjustment for everyone sharing a pastor between two places. I have done everything humanly possible to be present to both churches. Never did I think when I was ordained nearly fourteen years ago that my first pastorate would be of two parishes. Let us continue to pray for each other as we journey along the road of discipleship during these challenging and uncertain times.
