ALL SAINTS DAY PROJECT



Dear St. Mary's Family,

As we continue through this month of November, dedicated to all the holy souls that have gone before us, we remember and pray for our decreased loved ones in a particularly poignant way. Through what Jesus has done, we have hope, that not only, are our deceased loved ones still with us but that they await our journeying to them.

Last week on All Souls Day, I was at Resurrection Cemetery on Staten Island with Cardinal Dolan, several brother priests, and a large group of the faithful present for an All Souls Day Mass. In his homily, the Cardinal pointed out how often we use terminology that almost denies the faith we have in eternal life. He said we say things like, "They're gone" or "no longer with us" which is simply not true. The person who has died remains close to us in a real though different way. They are alive in what we call the Communion of Saints and still hear us when we speak to them. They truly are not "gone" or "no longer with us".

He remarked that a more appropriate phrase seems to be "passed away" since it reminds us of Jesus' own Passover from death to life, and that through Him we "pass over" from this world to the next to join the Lord Who has gone before us.

We continue this month to honor the saints that have shown us the beauty of authentic discipleship and pray for the holy souls in Purgatory that quickly they will behold the face of God.
