



GAUDETE SUNDAY

This Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. The rose-colored vestments for the Third Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday are a signal for the transition into the second part of Advent, which provides more intense preparation for the remaining days of Advent. Besides Gaudete Sunday, the Advent Ember Days and O Antiphons are the special treasures of the second phase of the Advent liturgy.

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete* Sunday because of the first word "Rejoice" in the *Introit* or entrance antiphon of Sunday's Liturgy. "Rejoice" is also repeated throughout the readings and prayers. The vestments worn by the priest can be the color rose (sometimes referred to as pink). The third candle of the Advent wreath is also rose. Both are reminders that Christ's coming is very soon; we are nearing the end of Advent, and we can hardly contain our joy.





Dear St. Mary's Family,

One of the greatest gifts that I have as pastor is the two wonderful Knights of Columbus councils in Chester and in Washingtonville. Last weekend, I was reminded of what a great gift they are.

I began my day in Washingtonville where I attended the pancake breakfast with Santa that the Knights of Columbus put on. When I went to the council hall and walked into the kitchen, I was greeted by the smiling faces and hard-working hands of the council members. It was great seeing the Boy Scouts and their families there as well, as they served the food to those that came. When I got in the car to go back to the parish for Mass, I was reminded of how much I missed events like this during my five years as vocation director when I was not involved in parish ministry.

Later in the day when I was in Chester, I watched as my Knights of Columbus there put up the remaining Christmas trees and the entirety of the lights for our fundraiser and Advent Christmas decoration. There were 50 trees that needed to be secured, and each tree had to have enough lights so that they would shine brightly during the rest of this blessed time of the year. These men gave up several hours of their Sunday to work in the cold and help out the parish. What a beautiful example.

Sometimes people are looking for ways to help the church or the community and for any man who feels this way, I cannot recommend strongly enough the Knights of Columbus. As a fourth-degree member myself, and the chaplain of both councils in Chester and Washingtonville, I know the incredible work that they are involved in for the Church and their community. I am so very grateful for all that they do and I encourage any man who seeks to serve the Lord in a profound and beautiful way to consider the Knights of Columbus.
